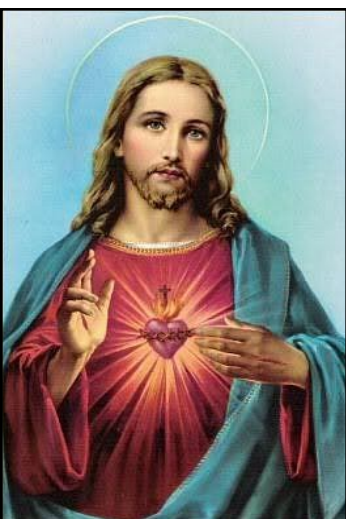

Meditations . . .

“... united in heart.”  
(Philippians 2:2)

Isn't it amazing to live in such a connected world? You can so easily search the internet to find answers to any question you have and to learn all about the latest events happening anywhere in the world. Yet we all know that there are challenges related to this quick access to information, and one of them is the quick access to opinions. And, as we often see, opinions lead to arguments, and arguments lead to divisions.

So when we hear St. Paul calling us to be “of the same mind” and “united in heart,” it can seem almost impossible (Philippians 2:2). It's hard enough staying civil and polite, but to actually be united in heart and mind? Can we even do that? Paul seems to think we can. So let's consider how we can apply his words to our lives today.

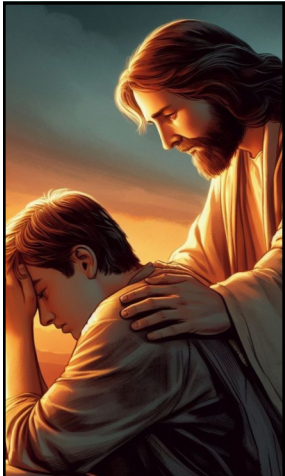
Consider Paul's audience: the Christians in Philippi. Paul isn't writing to the entire city. Why does that matter? Because we are called to a special kind of unity with our brothers and sisters in Christ. Our Church is diverse, and that's part of its beauty. But unity in the midst of diversity means that our opinions, as important as they may be, should not supersede our call to reveal the love of Christ through our unity: “This is how all will know that you are my disciples, if you have love for one another” (John 13:35).

So how can we embrace this calling? One way is to ask yourself if you should be spending less time taking in the news, political commentary, or celebrity gossip and more time serving God. The simple act of putting your energy toward listening to God and being among his people will bring down dividing walls and empower you to follow Jesus' command to love all of your brothers and sisters.

So enjoy the benefits of our connected world, but remember to guard the true, lasting unity of your family in Christ.

ACCORDING TO GOD'S WILL  
(Part 8—Final)

Mary: Hidden and Humble before the Lord

❖ 1) I will pray to God with Mary's own words: “May it be done to me according to your word” (Luke 1:38). No matter what is going on in your family or in your life, submit your will, your choices, and your future to God. Pray Mary's fiat often. Pray, also, as Jesus taught us: Let your will be done on earth (in my life, in my family, in my parish, in the Church, and in the world) as (perfectly as) it is in heaven.

❖ I will seek the lowest place. Throughout Jesus' life, Mary lived quietly, supporting him but without trying to bring attention to herself as his mother. She never sought the praise of the world. We can follow in Mary's footsteps, not seeking worldly honor or glory, but only trying to accomplish God's will each day, whatever that might be.

❖ I will trust that God is in charge. Mary must have felt honored and greatly blessed when the angel revealed to her how she was to serve God's plans. Later she felt sorrow and loss as she witnessed her son's death at Calvary. Neither experience changed her decision to yield to the Lord and serve him with her whole life. She trusted God; her discipleship was not dependent on circumstances but on faith. She trusted him, no matter what was going on, and we can, too.

❖ I will live in the light. When I see pride and other sins ruling my heart and rupturing my relationship with God, I will bring them into the light. I will choose humility over pride, admitting my missteps and asking the Lord for his mercy and grace.

Brothers and sisters, as you try to take these steps, you will be blessed! You, along with Mary, will hear Jesus say to you, “Blessed are the meek, for they will inherit the land” (Matthew 5:5).
