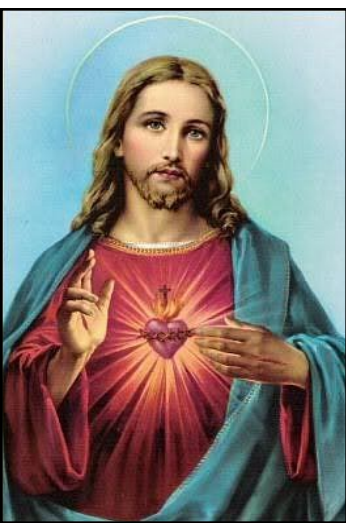

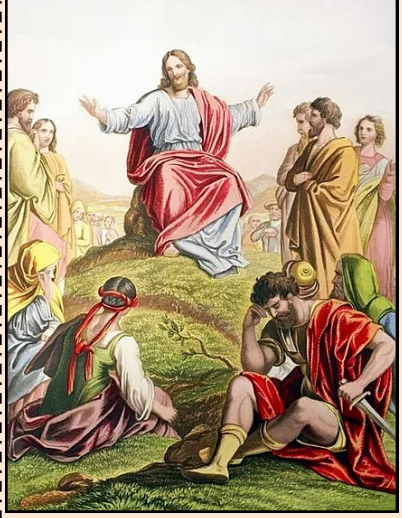

Meditations . . .

“One of them . . . returned, glorifying God.”
(Luke 17:15)

Jesus had healed ten people afflicted with leprosy, but only one of them returned to give him thanks. We might wonder why the others didn’t come back. Maybe they couldn’t connect the dots: God himself had healed them on their way. It seems that only this one person—a Samaritan—realized that he had been in the presence of the divine. And he didn’t just say, “Thank you,” either. He fell at Jesus’ feet and worshipped God “in a loud voice” (Luke 17:15).

This can be a model for us. Our own gratitude can lead us to worship the One who has given us abundant life, both now and forever.

We can worship the Lord in many ways, but today, let’s imitate the Samaritan in today’s Gospel:

He glorified God in a loud voice (Luke 17:15). You can worship the Lord in silent prayer, but giving praise to God out loud expresses your gratitude in a deliberate, concrete way. As your praise reaches the heavens, your heart will be lifted up as well. That’s why the psalmist writes, “Bless our God, you peoples; loudly sound his praise” (66:8).

He fell at the feet of Jesus (Luke 17:16). Worship also involves our posture. That’s why we stand and kneel at Mass. Maybe you like to pray in your favorite chair each morning. But occasionally, especially when you are offering praise and thanksgiving to the Lord, you might try standing, kneeling, or even lying prostrate on the floor. In all these ways, you are expressing your love and gratitude to the Lord with your body.

At Mass today, sing out your praise! Join the choir “in a loud voice” (Luke 17:15) and worship the Lord with all your heart. Kneel in adoration before the King of kings. Rejoice because the Lord says to you, as he did to the Samaritan, “Your faith has saved you” (17:19).

“Sing to the Lord a new song, for he has done wondrous deeds’ (Psalm 98:1).”

“Breaking Free”

How to pray for healing of memories
(Part 4)

Second, we need to make it clear that there are some situations where praying for healing should be accompanied by professional counseling or experienced spiritual direction. Some wounds go so deep and have so many side effects that it is best to seek help from someone with a good amount of wisdom and experience to help us. Parishes and diocesan offices are a good place to start if you believe you need this kind of help.

A central part of seeking inner healing has to do with examining our past carefully. “Are there any specific memories that I need to bring before the Lord?” Sometimes, the answer is obvious, but other times we may have to sit quietly and look at our relationships to see if anything surfaces. We may also need to look at relationships in our past, perhaps when we were children or young adults. Something may have happened years ago that has continued to bother us or has brought about a stronghold that is affecting our relationships today. Give yourself some time for reflection—and be sure to ask the Holy Spirit to help you.
