Meditations . . .

“Pray always without becoming weary.”
(Luke 18:1)

Jesus’ words in today’s Gospel can sound impossible: Pray always? Without growing weary? How can we do that? It’s so easy to grow weary in prayer, especially in those situations when God seems slow to answer. How do we not give up? What can we do when prayer feels hard? Let’s see what our readings tell us.

Be open to receiving help from your brothers and sisters. In the first reading, Moses lifts up his staff in prayer on a mountaintop while Joshua and his army battle Israel’s enemy, the Amalekites, in the valley below. But Moses begins to grow weary, so Aaron and Hur support his arms so that he can keep praying (Exodus 17:12). Because of his friends, Moses was able to persist, and that gave Israel the advantage over their enemy. It’s not always easy to ask for help when we’re struggling. But asking someone to pray for us—or with us—opens the door to God’s grace! A friend can intercede for us and offer support when we’re weary. Through their presence, they can show us that God is with us.

Turn to the Scriptures. In the second reading, Paul offers words of encouragement to his young disciple, Timothy. Paul senses that his martyrdom is near (2 Timothy 4:6), so he urges his friend to rely on something that is undying: the word of God. “All Scripture,” he says, “is inspired by God” (3:16). Scripture has divine power and can bring us hope when we are weary. It can bolster our faith and fill our minds with God’s truth. When we want to give up, we can remember, “My help is from the Lord, who made heaven and earth” (Psalm 121:2).

Rely on God. Whenever we struggle in prayer, we can ask God for his strength. Jesus himself intercedes for us, and the Spirit helps us in our weakness (Romans 8:26). Like the widow in today’s Gospel, we can keep bothering the Lord until he comes through. He’s our loving Father. He will always help us. We are never alone!

Brief Biography of:

Reverend Thomas Kalambadan

Reverend Thomas Kalambadan was ordained on December 29, 1991 in the Diocese of Kothamangdam, Kerala, South India as a Carmelite Religious Priest [Carmelites of Mary Immaculate –C.M.I.]. St. Thomas the Apostle, preached the Gospel in the first century in his state Kerala, Southwest of India. Rev. Thomas has been a priest for 34 years and has his Masters Degree in Social Work [M.S.W.], and was appointed as the Director of the Social Work Center in his province. He also served as Superior and Manager of a few places in his province.

He was in Germany for 5 years as Pastor, and is able to understand and converse in German!

He came to the United States in February of 2017, and upon entering the Tulsa Diocese (Oklahoma), he was appointed as Associate Pastor for 2 years at St. Bernard Parish in Tusla, Oklahoma. Afterwards, he was assigned as Hospital Chaplain for 5 years at St. Francis Xavier Hospital, Tulsa, Oklahoma.

On July 1, 2024, he arrived at the San Angelo Diocese to serve as Parochial Administrator here at Sacred Heart Catholic Church, in Coleman, Tx., and at Our Lady of Mount Carmel Church in Winters, Tx.

Since arriving in Texas, Rev. Thomas has experienced the vast differences in climate (getting the worst sunburn in his life!), as well as the cultural and local customs of these communities.

He now serves these communities with his inspiring homilies, his hard work, his willingness to work hands-on the parish facilities and grounds, and most importantly, his loving and generous acceptance of all his parishioners.

May God continue to bless him and his parish communities!
