Meditations . . .

The Lord . . . knows no favorites. (Sirach 35:12)

Many siblings joke with—or taunt—each other about being their mother’s or father’s “favorite.” Their parents will protest that they have no favorites. And although it’s true that they love each of their children deeply, it’s natural to have preferences. That’s why siblings sometimes engage in friendly competition to win over Mom or Dad.

So it can be hard to believe Sirach when he tells us that God “knows no favorites” (35:12). But it’s true! There is nothing any of us can do to convince the Lord that he should love us more than someone else. If anything, his heart goes out more to the oppressed and the lowly, and their prayer “pierces the clouds” (35:17). Their humility and their need, not their achievements or wealth, draw God’s heart toward them.

We see this truth played out in the parable Jesus tells in today’s Gospel. When a Pharisee and a tax collector come to the Temple to pray, the Pharisee seems to think he can sway the Lord’s opinion of him with his long list of accomplishments. But it doesn’t work. Neither his status nor his résumé qualifies him for special favors. The one who “went home justified,” the one who received God’s grace, was the tax collector, who approached God with humility and lowliness (Luke 18:14). He knew that he couldn’t earn God’s approval, so he admitted his need and pleaded for mercy.

The Lord knows no favorites. That’s a truth that you can hold onto today. But you can also hold onto the truth that you are a beloved child of God. Your position before him is secure. There’s nothing you can do to make him love you more. There’s nothing you have done that will make him love you less. So just come to him, trusting in his mercy, and let him love you—completely—for who you are!

Brief Biography of:

Reverend Thomas Kalambadan

Reverend Thomas Kalambadan was ordained on December 29, 1991 in the Diocese of Kothamangdam, Kerala, South India as a Carmelite Religious Priest [Carmelites of Mary Immaculate –C.M.I.]. St. Thomas the Apostle, preached the Gospel in the first century in his state Kerala, Southwest of India. Rev. Thomas has been a priest for 34 years and has his Masters Degree in Social Work [M.S.W.], and was appointed as the Director of the Social Work Center in his province. He also served as Superior and Manager of a few places in his province.

He was in Germany for 5 years as Pastor, and is able to understand and converse in German!

He came to the United States in February of 2017, and upon entering the Tulsa Diocese (Oklahoma), he was appointed as Associate Pastor for 2 years at St. Bernard Parish in Tusla, Oklahoma. Afterwards, he was assigned as Hospital Chaplain for 5 years at St. Francis Xavier Hospital, Tulsa, Oklahoma.

On July 1, 2024, he arrived at the San Angelo Diocese to serve as Parochial Administrator here at Sacred Heart Catholic Church, in Coleman, Tx., and at Our Lady of Mount Carmel Church in Winters, Tx.

Since arriving in Texas, Rev. Thomas has experienced the vast differences in climate (getting the worst sunburn in his life!), as well as the cultural and local customs of these communities.

He now serves these communities with his inspiring homilies, his hard work, his willingness to work hands-on the parish facilities and grounds, and most importantly, his loving and generous acceptance of all his parishioners.

May God continue to bless him and his parish communities!
