

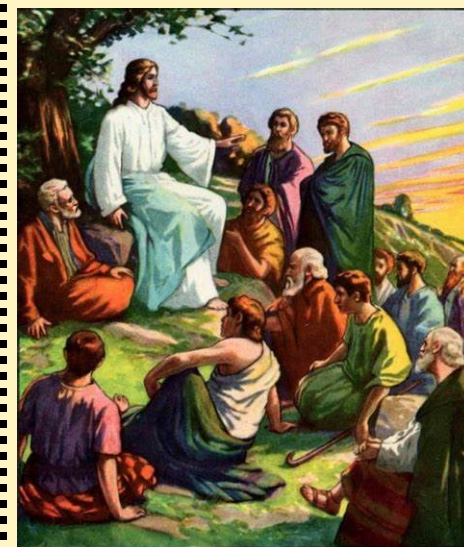

Meditations . . .

Do not be afraid. (Revelation 1:17)

Anyone would have been afraid! Most Jews believed that if they saw the glory of God face-to-face, they would die. This explains why St. John, who wrote the Book of Revelation, collapsed to the ground when he was brought into the presence of the “one like a son of man” (Revelation 1:13). Even John, who had walked with Jesus, witnessed his transfiguration, laid his head on Jesus’ breast, and watched as he ascended to heaven, was overwhelmed!

Jesus’ response to John is perfect for today’s celebration of Divine Mercy Sunday: “Do not be afraid” (Revelation 1:17). He didn’t tell John that there was no reason to fear; he touched him, offered a word of encouragement, and raised him up. That expression of love and intimacy overcame John’s fears and enabled him to stand before his glorious Lord. That’s what mercy is all about! It’s the perfect love of God, which “drives out fear” (1 John 4:18).


This is the same mercy Jesus showed to Thomas in today’s Gospel. Thomas doubted the resurrection because he hadn’t seen it with his own eyes. But Jesus came and invited Thomas to touch his wounds and “believe” (John 20:27). Like John, Thomas experienced a mercy that saw his unworthiness and still drew him close.

We can experience that mercy, too. Jesus knows that in the light of his glory, we are all frail and flawed. He knows that in the light of his truth, we often doubt and distrust. He knows we are not worthy to come to him on our own merits. Yet in his power and holiness and glory, he is patient with us. As he did for Thomas, he sees our weakness and shores up our faith. As he did for John, he calms our fearful hearts and assures us of his love.

So don’t be afraid to come to Jesus today. Don’t be afraid to let him see you as you truly are. Come and hear him say, “Do not be afraid.”

“Jesus, thank you for the depths of your mercy!”

Remembering a Man of the Spirit

Pope Francis died on **April 21, 2025**, Easter Monday morning, ending an extraordinary papacy that began on a cold evening just over twelve years earlier.

“Brothers and sisters, good evening. You know that the duty of the conclave was to give a bishop to Rome. It seems that my brother cardinals went almost to the end of the world to get him. But here I am.”

With those words, Pope Francis introduced himself to the world on a cold, rainy night in St. Peter’s Square on March 13, 2013.

He was indeed, from a traditional European perspective, almost from “the end of the world.” Born Jorge Mario Bergoglio, the son of Italian immigrants to Argentina, Francis was keenly aware that his election as supreme pontiff was historic. A man of the southern hemisphere, he was from what he described as “the periphery,” in this case a continent underrepresented in the College of Cardinals despite its vast Catholic population, a continent that bore the wounds of colonialism, yet in many ways was forward-looking as it grappled with the challenges facing the Church in its twenty-first century.

Pope Francis was not an intellectual in the style of Pope Benedict. He did not arrive to the papacy with the youthful vigor of St. John Paul II. He built on their legacies, in many ways, but did not see himself in the same mold—as someone who was shaped by recent European conflicts and the Cold War and who needed to reassert the traditions and teachings of the Church.

Pope Francis, the 266th pope of the Roman Catholic Church, passed away on the morning of Monday, April 21, at the age of 88, after suffering a stroke. His death marks the end of a transformative papacy that began in 2013. The Vatican has announced that his funeral will take place on Saturday, April 26, 2025, at 10:00 a.m. in St. Peter’s Square, Rome.
