

Meditations . . .

*“Truly, this was the Son of God!”
(Matthew 27:54)*

If Jesus were the star of a Hollywood movie, his triumphal entrance into Jerusalem would surely be the end of the film: a joyous celebration of the Messiah receiving the recognition and honor that he deserves. The movie would show how Jesus lived a sinless life, how he spent three years proclaiming and demonstrating that the kingdom of God was at hand, and how he trained his disciples. And in spite of some misunderstandings during his time of ministry, at last the crowds would finally acknowledge who he really was: the Son of God, the promised Messiah. The end.

But as we read in today’s Gospel, Palm Sunday was actually the beginning of one of the most significant weeks in history. Although it seemed as if things took a turn for the worse as the week went on—with Jesus’ betrayal, abandonment, torture, and death—God’s plan of salvation for the world was unfolding.

In a homily on Palm Sunday, St. Bernard of Clairvaux remarked,

How different the cries that now are calling him “King of Israel” and then in a few days’ time will be saying, “We have no king but Caesar!” What a contrast between the green branches and the cross, between the flowers and the thorns! Before they were offering their own clothes for him to walk upon, and so soon afterwards they are stripping him of his, and casting lots upon them.

As you begin Holy Week, join the crowds in shouting, “Hosanna to the Son of David!” (Matthew 21:9). Then stay with Jesus all week as he prepares to suffer and die. Take some time each day to consider this one realization in today’s Gospel: “Truly, this was the Son of God!” (27:54). Jesus, the Son of God, suffered and died for you—and that is better than any Hollywood ending.

“Hosanna! Jesus, my King and my Lord, I praise you!”

“LOVE ONE ANOTHER, AS I HAVE LOVED YOU.” (John:34)

Part V [Excerpt from *The Word Among Us*]
Jim and Monica Murphy were devoted parents.

Israel was the foundation of this restoration. God chose the descendants of Abraham and Sarah as his special possession and formed them over a long period through the work of servants like Moses, Jeremiah, and Ezra. Finally, he sent his own Son, Jesus, to deliver us all from the pain of sin and separation, and to empower us to love one another as his church.

Jesus came to initiate a kingdom free from division, where we would worship God in genuine unity: “The hour is coming, and now is, when the true worshipers will worship the Father in spirit and truth, for such the Father seeks to worship him” (John 4:23). Jesus spoke these words to a Samaritan woman, a person of dubious morals whose religion—a mixture of Jewish and pagan rituals—was despised by Jesus’ Jewish brethren. In love, however, Jesus looked through these obstacles and touched her heart, bringing her to a living experience of the gospel.

When the Spirit came upon the church at Pentecost, the early believers received such power and love that they were able to overcome the age-old division between Jew and Gentile. Through the power of the Spirit, the Council of Jerusalem was able to establish an approach to unity that human efforts alone seemed incapable of achieving (Acts 15:1-35). Similarly, in our century, the Second Vatican Council, inspired by the same Spirit, has called for unity between all Christians: “The restoration of unity among all Christians is one of the principal concerns of the Second Vatican Council” (Decree on Ecumenism, 1).
