Meditations . . .

“God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him . . . might have eternal life.”
(John 3:16)

God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him . . . might have eternal life. (John 3:16)

This verse from the Gospel of John may be the most famous passage in the whole Bible. It’s especially appropriate on this feast of the Exaltation of the Cross because it’s a concise summary of why the cross of Christ is central to our faith. Let’s reflect on it today.

Love. “God so loved the world that he gave his only Son” (John 3:16, emphasis added). God is a communion of three Persons, with a love and unity beyond our comprehension. Yet this triune God so desired to share his perfect love with us that the Son of God became a man. Out of that love, Jesus was willing to suffer and die on the cross—all so that he could save us. This love is so immense; it knows no bounds. It will go to any lengths and give everything to bring us into God’s loving embrace.

Life. “. . . so that everyone who believes in him might not perish but might have eternal life” (John 3:16, emphasis added). God never wanted us to die. In Adam, we brought death upon ourselves when we turned away from God and went our own way. But on the cross, Jesus offered himself up as “expiation for our sins” (1 John 2:2). Through the shedding of his blood, Jesus conquered sin and death for everyone. This means that we can begin to experience eternal life even now. We don’t have to be slaves to sin, and we don’t have to fear death! When we do sin, the Holy Spirit can assure us of God’s mercy and forgiveness. And now, we can look forward in hope to life everlasting in his presence.

Love and life: this is the message of the cross. Today at Mass, gaze at the cross, and thank God for all that he has done for you in Christ Jesus, your Lord!

“Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, may the cross always remind me of your overflowing love for me.”

Breaking Free

"How to pray for healing of memories"

(Part 1)

The story of Joseph (Genesis 37–42) sounds too good to be true, doesn’t it?

Joseph’s ability to keep his peace despite such painful injustices is so heroic that we might be tempted to dismiss it as just a charming tale. But this is part of Scripture, part of God’s inspired revelation to us. This is one of many stories in the Bible that point us to Jesus and give us insight into the life he has called us to.

For example, Joseph was sold by his brothers for twenty pieces of silver, while Jesus was betrayed by Judas for thirty silver pieces. Joseph was falsely accused, and so was Jesus. In prison Joseph met two prisoners, Pharaoh’s cupbearer and the royal baker. One was released; one was not. On the cross, Jesus encountered two prisoners. One entered paradise; the other did not. Joseph was exalted to rule Egypt under the Pharaoh, and Jesus was raised to the right hand of God. In all these instances, both Joseph and Jesus show us a godly way to deal with tragedy, injustice, and hatred. The Sting of the Past. What about us? It can be so hard to rise above our sufferings or to be as forgiving as Joseph was. We may react well when we are feeling blessed, but it’s often a different story when someone close to us hurts us. We find it hard to forgive. We may think or even say cruel things to the person. We may get resentful and even seek some kind of revenge.
